

# PROJECT STATUS REPORT Caton Farm Road/Bruce Road Phase I Study February 13, 2006

## Environmental Processing Requirements

- The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act have separate environmental processing requirements.
- Federal actions with the potential for environmental impacts must follow the **NEPA/404 Merger Process** which provides for the NEPA and Section 404 processes to be completed concurrently.
- The FHWA, the USACOE, the USEPA, the USFWS, state and county highway agencies, and state regulatory and resource agencies are the principal participants in the interagency coordination process.

### Goals of the NEPA/404 Merger Process

- Assure the timely, cost effective development of needed, environmentally sensitive Federal-Aid highway projects.
- Provide an orderly procedure (through early identification of environmental resources at a sufficient level of detail) to develop quality documentation that addresses NEPA and Section 404 requirements.

### **Regulatory and Resource Agency Issues**

- USACOE Selection of Caton Farm Road/Bruce Road River Crossing Location.
- USFWS Presence of federally listed species near 6 of 7 river crossing alternatives:
  - **S** Lakeside Daisy
  - **S** Leafy Prairie Clover
  - S Hine's Emerald Dragonfly
  - S Indiana Bat
- USCG National security issue: proximity to Lockport Lock and Dam.

### Alternatives Analysis and Screening (Chapter 3 of Environmental Assessment)

- The above issues have necessitated that we redevelop and reevaluate earlier improvement alternatives.
- Exhibit 1 depicts the range of River Crossing Corridors that have been considered.
- Exhibit 2 depicts the 3 alternative river crossing locations with approach roadway alignment alternatives that have been considered.
  - Caton Farm Road Bruce Road Alignments pass through Section 4(f) land and critical habitat for Hines Emerald Dragonfly.
  - Caton Farm Road Oak Avenue Alignments avoid park land and critical habitat.
  - Theodore Street Rosalind Road Alignments do not meet Purpose and

Need.

- Chapter 3 recommends carrying the Caton Farm Road Bruce Road and Caton Farm Road Oak Avenue alternatives forward for further detailed study.
- Draft of Chapter 3 has been completed and submitted to IDOT and FHWA for review.
